UPDATES AND GUIDANCE FROM UGANDA HEALTH PROFESSIONS ASSESSMENT BOARD

The Uganda Health Professions Assessment Board (UHPAB) appreciates the work you are doing to train future health workers. As we approach the conduct of the third series of UHPAB assessment scheduled for June 2026, the Board wishes to draw your attention to the following: -

1. Assessment of Allied Health, Nursing, and Midwifery TVET candidates with pending retake papers

Principals of TVET Health Training Institutions are requested to notify all former candidates who were assessed by the former Uganda Allied Health Examinations Board (UAHEB) from the year 2010 to 2024 and former Uganda Nurses and Midwives Examinations Board (UNMEB) from the year 2018 and 2024, with pending retakes to apply for assessment to complete their training. The dates for assessment will be communicated to all eligible candidates by the Board.

Candidates are therefore required to submit the following to the UHPAB secretariat from 28th May 2026 to 28th June 2026.

- (i) A letter of application for assessment written through the Principal of the respective TVET Training Institution, duly signed and stamped by the Principal.



- (ii) Clear information of the candidate's study program, year of entry, semester(s), paper(s) applied for, and Uganda Allied Health Examinations Board (UAHEB) Registration Number and Nursing Student Identification Number (NSIN).
- (iii) A copy of the school identity card and national Identity card.
- (iv) Three colored passport-size photographs.
- (v) An available day time telephone contact and functional email address.

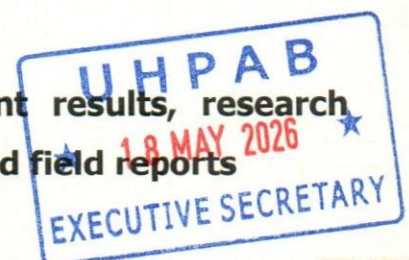
2. Display of lists of candidates registered for the June, 2026 assessment

Lists of candidates registered for the June 2026 assessment, produced by UHPAB and forwarded to Health Training Institutions, are expected to be displayed on the institutions' notice boards for candidates' viewing. Any corrections should be submitted to UHPAB before the 29th of May 2026. Stand warned that no new registrations will be accepted after issuance of the registration lists from UHPAB are issued to the Training institutions for display.

3. Registration of candidates for retake papers

Addendum to circular N0. UHPAB/ES/25/004 dated 23rd March, 2026, stipulates that candidates shall be allowed to sit for a maximum of 3 retakes in each semester. You are expected to guide your trainees accordingly in relation to the UHPAB Assessment Time Table. Feedback on which papers each candidate will sit should be submitted to the Executive Secretary by Friday, 22nd May, 2026, to enable the Board to process assessment cards with correct information.

4. Submission of School Based Assessment results, research reports, practical logbooks for retakes, and field reports



All SBA results, research reports for diploma candidates, practical logbooks for retakes, and field reports for Environmental Health programs must be submitted to UHPAB from 18th to 29th May 2026. Results for SBA must be submitted both in hard and soft copy formats. Please observe the following guidelines: -

- (i) Online submission of SBA results should be done from 18th to 27th May, 2026. In case of any challenges, you can call IT office for assistance.
- (ii) Hard copies for SBA results may be submitted on the day of picking materials from UHPAB.
- (iii) Only SBA results accurately entered in the UHPAB SBA submission template, duly signed by the Principal and Academic Registrar, will be accepted.
- (iv) Ensure that the correct SBA results are entered in the template for the right paper before submission to UHPAB.
- (v) Hard copies of SBA results that are not signed by the Trainees will not be accepted. Ensure that all Trainees sign before submission.

5. Compliance with standards and guidance for hosting an assessment center

- a) Following corrective directives and follow-up inspections conducted from 13th to 17th April 2026, all affected Assessment Centres are hereby reminded to ensure adequate clinical exposure, sufficient assessment facilities, and well-equipped skills laboratories with the required sundries, reagents, instruments, equipment, and models for successful and standardised assessment. Compliance reports should be submitted to the UHPAB by 29th May, 2026. Please note

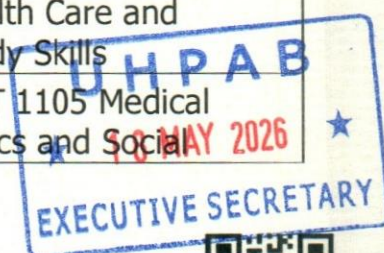


that non-compliant assessment centers will not be accepted to conduct the June, 2026 assessment.

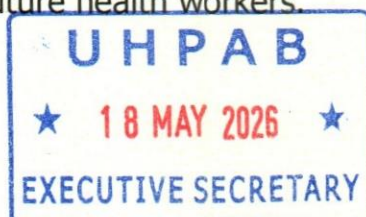
